

Class Descriptions

Turnout, Reinsmanship, Working Pleasure—In each of the "arena" or "rail" classes, the horse and driver work both directions of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot, and are required to rein back. ADSRulebook, Chapter 4, Article 217-222.

Turnout is judged primarily on the overall impression of horse and driver: condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire. **Reinsmanship** is judged primarily on the skill and ability of the driver. **WorkingPleasure** is judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive.

Pick Your Route—After passing the starting line, the driver proceeds through each obstacle to the designated finish line, choosing his or her own route. Each obstacle is negotiated once and only once, but may be approached from either direction. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. For additional information, see the ADS Rulebook, Chapter 17, Article 248.

Gamblers Choice—Driven over a course of unnumbered obstacles, each with a specific point value. Each driver has the same amount of time to negotiate as many obstacles as possible. Each obstacle can be driven twice but not in succession. No obstacle can be re-driven once it has been disturbed unless it is meant to be knocked down. A signal will sound at the end of the time and the driver must then exit through the finish markers. If the signal sounds when the driver is committed to an obstacle, the competitor may complete the obstacle and then proceed to the finish marker for total time to be recorded. ADS Rulebook Chapter 17, Article 249.

CarriageDog—Judged primarily on suitability of the dog to serve as a companion (maximum one dog per vehicle). To be judged both ways in the arena at a walk, slow trot and working trot. a. The dog should be standing, lying down or seated on the vehicle. b. The dog must be under control at all times. c. The dog must not be led on the ground from the vehicle or be restrained by being tied to the vehicle, driver or passenger. d. The driver should not hold the dog, and the dog should not interfere with the driver in any way. 231.2 The dog may be of any breed. 231.3 To be judged • 60% on the suitability of the dog to serve as a companion. • 30% on the performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s) • 10% on the overall impression of the turnout, including the dog. • Entries with a dog clearly not under control may be eliminated. ADS Rulebook, Chapter 6, Article 231

Timed Obstacles—Driven over course consisting of up to 20 paired cones. After crossing the starting line, the driver proceeds through the cones in numerical order to the finish line. For additional information, see the ADS Rulebook, Chapter 7, Article 247.

CrossCountry Pace: To be driven at a prescribed pace (Horse—14kph; Large Pony 12 kph; Small Pony 11 kph and VSE 9 kph). Course will be approximately 2-3 km in length and will go through wooded areas, over a bridge and on some concrete road areas and numbered gates. Placings are determined on a low course fault basis and then the horse closest to the ideal pace time if the drivers are tied with equal number of faults. Faults include disobedience of horse to go through an obstacle or gate. A map of the country pace course will be available at check-in along with a more detailed list of course penalties. House Rules will be handed out at drivers meeting.

Training level CT: Will consist of Dressage and Cones: Open to a horse that has not completed more than one recognized Combined Driving Event (CDE) or Driving Trial (DT) above the Training division, driven by a driver of any level of competitive experience, or open to a driver who has not completed more than one recognized CDE or DT above the Training division, with a horse of any level of competitive experience. The purpose of training tests is to establish that the correct foundation is being laid for the training of the driving horse requiring the horse to move freely forward in a free walk on long rein and the working trot, in rhythm while accepting the bit with relaxation, through transitions and 40m circles. Cones will follow immediately after an individual dressage test and is designed to test the fitness, obedience and suppleness of the horses and the skill and competence of the Athletes. Training level B, 80m will be used for the dressage test.

- I. Large Pony, equines (120cm to 148cm; with or without shoes; 149cm with shoes)

- VI Multiples, any hitch with more than 1 horse to include pairs, tandems and teams
- VII Novice, open to any horse or driver who has not won 3 first place ribbons at ADS shows





Championship Divisions

Very Small Equine (VSE); less than 99cm; with or without shoes.

Open Small Pony; 99cm to less than 120 cm; with or without shoes.

Open Large Pony; 120cm to 148 cm with or without shoes; 149 cm with shoes.

Open Horse; equine over 148 cm (with shoes over 149 cm)

Novice Driver (no more than 3 blue ribbons at 3 ADS recognized Pleasure Driving shows)

Novice Horse (no more than 3 blue ribbons at 3 ADS recognized Pleasure Driving shows)

Pairs/Multiples (any size of equines and configuration)

Utility (Marathon) Vehicle* see below

Juniors (youth who will not be 19 years of age on or before December 31, 2022; Article 2.7)

Midwest Carriage Festival is recognized by the American Driving Society, Inc. and every class offered herein which is covered by the current rules and specifications of the Society will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Liability

The American Driving Society, Inc., Midwest Carriage Festival, LLC, Walworth County Agricultural Society, Inc., their committees, directors, officers, officials, and staff will not be responsible for any claim resulting from injury or injuries to any person, horse/pony, or loss or damage to property incurred on the show grounds, staging/stabling area, or on any course. Furthermore, in all situations the driver assumes the responsibility and the liability for any injury or damage to himself/herself, to groom or grooms, and/or passenger/passengers riding with them in the vehicle. All persons riding on any vehicle must sign a waiver which must be on file with the show secretary. Competitors in violation are subject to disqualification from the show.

Dogs All dogs must be on a leash. Any dog not so restrained will be detained and turned over to the local animal control officer. Please pick up all dog poop!

Tires/Wheels The use of pneumatic tires is permitted with Marathon Vehicles. The use of wire wheels is permitted only for VSE equines in any class they may enter. Wire wheels are permitted on antique vehicles per ADS Rule Book Article 206.2.

Safety It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure all harness is in good repair and the vehicle is in sound condition. **Under no circumstance or condition may a bridle be removed from an equine while it is still put to a vehicle.** A throat latch and full nose band/cavesson are mandatory. An appropriate whip must be carried in hand at all times while driving. **When an equine is put to a vehicle, a capable person must be on the carriage with reins in hand at all times.**

Stallions Junior Drivers and Novice Drivers are prohibited from driving stallions.

Health Requirements A copy of a negative Equine Infectious Anemia "Coggins" test dated within 12 months of the show must accompany each entry. ADS requires all equines be vaccinated for Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes (EHV-1) within 6 months of the show date and not less than 14 days prior to arrival on grounds. A veterinary certificate, vaccination form from ADS, or veterinary waiver statement must accompany each entry. For equines not vaccinated due to waiver, a log of body temperature is required twice daily while on show grounds. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required for all equines not from Wisconsin.

Motorized Vehicle Notice: At any ADS recognized event, minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the jurisdiction in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind (including but not limited to: golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles) at the event location. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties and/or sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense.

Class Descriptions

Best of Show House Class. Judges to consider performance in obstacles classes, overall care of equine(s) and stabling area, and "Best of Show" ring class, which is to be judged 50% on quality of turnout, 25% on suitability of equine to provide a pleasant drive, and 25% on the ability and skill of the driver. By invitation only. No entry fee.

Carriage Dog - Article 231 Judged primarily on the suitability of the dog to serve as a companion (maximum one dog per vehicle). To be judged both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, and working trot. The dog should be standing, lying down, or seated on the vehicle. Dog must be on the vehicle at all times. The dog must be under control at all times. The dog must not be led on the ground from the vehicle or be restrained by being tied to the vehicle, driver, or passenger. The driver should not hold the dog, and the dog should not interfere with the driver in any way.

Concours d'Elegance - Article 230 To be judged as a separate class. The essence of the competition is the word "Elegance." The winner will be the turnout which, in the opinion of the judge, presents the most elegant effect. This will include the vehicle, harness, appointments, horse(s), driver, passengers, grooms, etc. but above all general impression is most important. Vehicle and harness may be inspected to ensure thoughtful restoration and careful maintenance. Attention will be paid to the personal appearance of the driver, grooms, and passengers as it contributes to the overall picture. Period costumes are definitely prohibited. Performance will not be judged unless it detracts from the elegance of the turnout. By invitation only. No entry fee.

Fault Obstacles - Article 250.3 To be driven over prescribed course of numbered obstacles, not to exceed 20 obstacles. After passing through the start line the driver proceeds through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line. Placings to be determined on a low-fault basis. Course faults and one fault for each second commenced over the time allowed are added together for a total score. Time allowed is calculated as per Article 240. Time will decide ties for those with equal fault totals. Minimum clearance will be 35 cm plus track width for horses and ponies and will be 30 cm plus track width for VSE's.

Ladies Driving Class - Article 219 Entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the turnout for a lady with emphasis on manners. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. Must rein back without resistance and must stand quietly at any location in the arena. To be judged 50% on manners, performance, elegance, and suitability of the turnout for a lady; 25% on skill of the driver; 25% overall impression.

Gentleman's Driving Class - Article 220 Entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the turnout for a gentleman with emphasis on manners. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. May show a degree of boldness but not excessive speed. Must rein back without resistance and must stand quietly at any location in the arena. To be judged 50% on manners, performance, and suitability of the turnout for a gentleman; 25% on skill of the driver; 25% on overall impression.

Reinsmanship - Article 223 A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged on the ability and skill of the driver. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. Drivers shall be required to rein back. All drivers chosen for a workout may be worked at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests. The driver should be seated comfortably on the box so as to be relaxed and effective. Either the one or two-handed method of driving is acceptable. Common to both methods, the

elbows and arms should be close to the body with an allowing but steady hand enabling a consistent feel with the equine's mouth. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one general style over the other. To be judged 75% on handling of reins and whip, control, posture and overall impression of driver; 25% on the condition of harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.

Scurry Obstacle - Article 248.1 To be driven over a course of unnumbered obstacles consisting of cones and balls, not to exceed 10 obstacles. After passing through the Start markers from any direction, the driver proceeds through each obstacle from any direction, in any order. Each obstacle must be driven once. Upon completion of the course, the driver must pass through the Finish markers from any direction, where time will be taken. Refusals and run-outs will not be penalized. Course faults will be scored as penalty seconds and added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings will be determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first place will be broken by a drive-off, unless otherwise stated in the ADS Omnibus.

Turnout - Article 217 A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, spares and appointments, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression; 30% on performance, manners, and way of going of equine(s).

Working - Article 218 A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the equine to provide a pleasant drive. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly, both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back. All entries chosen for a workout may be asked to execute appropriate tests. To be judged 70% on performance, manners, and way of going of the equine(s); 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire.

Your Route/My Route - Article 248.6 To be driven over a course of 10 numbered obstacles. The suggested minimum obstacle clearance is 200 cm for paired markers and a minimum of 3.6 m for multiple obstacles such as "L" and "U" shapes. Your route: After passing through the start markers, the driver drives through all 10 obstacles in the correct sequence and direction. My route: After completing the #10 obstacle, the competitor will continue, without passing through the Start/Finish markers by driving all obstacles a second time in any sequence and in either direction. Time will be taken when passing through the Finish markers in either direction. Entries may be stopped by a signal from the judge after completing the #10 obstacle to allow dislodged/disturbed obstacles to be rebuilt. Course faults are assessed as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first may be decided by a drive-off (unless otherwise stated in the ADS Omnibus).

UTILITY DIVISION

Open to single horse/pony driven to two- or four-wheeled training, marathon, or contemporary vehicle. Pneumatic tires are permitted.

NOVICE EQUINE DIVISION

Entries are ineligible for Novice classes after winning at least one first place ribbon in each of three ADS-recognized and/or USEF-licensed Carriage Pleasure driving competitions. Article 214.2

CHALLENGED DRIVER DIVISION

Eligibility requires active enrollment in a certified therapeutic driving program. Able-bodied driver required, two sets of reins allowed. Whip rule waived for driver, if necessary, but MUST be held by able-bodied whip in that case. All other ADS rules apply with consideration. Divisional classes for Challenged Drivers are Working, Reinsmanship, Gambler's Choice, and Fault and Out.

Class Descriptions

TURNOUT

A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged: 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression, 30% on performance, manners and way of going. *Article 217*

WORKING

A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly, both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back. To be judged: 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s), 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle, 10% on neatness of attire. *Article 218*

LADY'S DRIVING CLASS *

Entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the turnout for a lady with emphasis on manners. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. May show a degree of boldness but not excessive speed. Must rein back without resistance and must stand quietly at any location in the arena. To be judged: 50% on manners, performance and suitability of the turnout for a gentleman, 25% on skill of the driver, 25% on overall impression. *Article 219*

GENTLEMAN'S DRIVING CLASS*

Entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the turnout for a gentleman with emphasis on manners. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. May show a degree of boldness but not excessive speed. Must rein back without resistance and must stand quietly at any location in the arena. To be judged: 50% on manners, performance and suitability of the turnout for a gentleman, 25% on skill of the driver, 25% on overall impression. *Article 220*

REINSMANSHIP

A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. Drivers are required to rein back. All drivers chosen for a work-off may be worked at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests. The driver should be seated comfortably on the box so as to be relaxed and effective. Either the one-or two-handed method of driving is acceptable. Common to both methods, the elbows and arms should be close to the body with an allowing but steady hand enabling a consistent "feel" with the horse's mouth. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one general style over another. To be judged: 75% on handling of reins and whip, control, posture, and overall impression of driver, 25% on the condition of harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.

FAULT AND OUT OBSTACLES

A timed course of numbered obstacles to be driven at the trot. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area and not to exceed 10 obstacles. After passing through the Start markers, the driver proceeds through each consecutively numbered obstacle, in order, until the allowed time expires (suggested time, 90 seconds to two minutes), or until an obstacle is dislodged or a disobedience occurs. If all the obstacles are driven cleanly before the allowed time expires, the driver will begin the course again, starting with obstacle #1, without having to pass through the Start markers. Passing through the Start markers more than once is not considered "off course" and is not penalized. Two points will be scored for each obstacle cleared before the allowed time expires, a disobedience occurs or an obstacle is dislodged.

GAMBLER'S CHOICE OBSTACLES

To be driven over a course of unnumbered obstacles, each carrying a specific point value. Each driver has the same allowed time to negotiate as many obstacles as possible. Each obstacle is assigned a point value according to its degree of difficulty and each driver tries to amass as high a score as possible within the time allowed. After passing through the Start markers, the driver may drive through the obstacles, in any order, from any direction. Each obstacle may be driven twice, but not in succession. If driven a third time, no points will be awarded. No obstacle may be re-driven once it has been disturbed (exception: obstacles which are designed to be knocked down). No points will be awarded for an incorrectly driven obstacle. If the obstacle is incorrectly driven, but not disturbed, it may be attempted again. If a horse should refuse or run out at an obstacle without disturbing it, the driver may elect not to attempt it and may drive to another obstacle without penalty. The obstacle may be attempted later. If it is correctly driven the appropriate points will be recorded. A signal will sound at the end of the allowed time and the driver must then exit through the Finish markers where the total time on the course will be recorded.

CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE*

No entry fee. Entries selected by official during Saturday classes. The essence of the competition is the word "Elegance." The winner will be the turnout which, in the opinion of the judge, presents the most elegant effect. This will include vehicle, harness, appointments, horse(s), driver, passengers, grooms, etc., but above all, general impression is most important. Vehicle and harness may be inspected to ensure thoughtful restoration and careful maintenance. Attention will be paid to the personal appearance of the driver, grooms, and passengers as it contributes to the overall picture. Period costumes are definitely prohibited, unless otherwise stated in the ADS Omnibus. Performance will not be judged unless it detracts from the elegance of the turnout. Article 230

DOG TO RIDE (NON-ADS) *

Dogs should display all the qualities of the finest coaching canines – first and foremost the attitude that they belong on the carriage and they are the center of attention. Fancy dress optional. Multiple dogs are allowed. Dogs must not be tied to the carriage. Competitors will be severely penalized if the dog interferes with the ability of the driver to control the turnout in its entirety.

WELL-WORN WHIPS *

Judged as a Working Pleasure Driving class. Entries limited to drivers 60 years and older.

- 4) I also agree, without any limitation or condition, to hold the ADS, its officers, directors, employees and agents, and Competition judges, officials, volunteers and organizing committee, harmless from any and all liability, loss, claims or actions, causes of action, judgments or demands of any nature whatsoever, and specifically as they may be the result of communicable diseases.

I am fully aware and appreciate that equine sports, including driving in this Event, involve inherent dangerous risk of serious injury or death. By participating I do so voluntarily and expressly assume any and all risks of injury to me or loss of my horse(s) or equipment. I agree to release and voluntarily waive the right to sue the ADS, its officers, directors, employees, and agents, stewards, Event judges, personnel, volunteers, officials, and organizing committee, including their agents and employees from and against all claims for damages, including money damages, for any action taken or otherwise any harm caused by me or my horse to others, including whether arising from directly or indirectly from the negligence of the ADS or the Event or the Event organizer.

I agree to indemnify and hold harmless the ADS, its officers, directors, employees, clinicians, members, volunteers, coaches, representatives, assigns, Event judges, officials and organizing committee, their agents and employees from any and all claims for loss or injury caused by me or my horse that occur during or in conjunction with this Event. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the ADS and/or this Event may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of this Event for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the Event, sport, or the ADS.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any ADS Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, Event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the ADS Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at this Event. I agree to self-monitor my temperature once daily prior to entering the event grounds and will not enter the facility if I have a. a temperature of 100.4°F (38°C), b. exhibit any COVID-19 symptoms (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/symptoms-testing/symptoms.html) or have tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 7 or 10 days, or c. if I have been in contact with someone who has COVID-19 symptoms or who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 7-10 days. *Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during the course of performing duties are exempt from c. I agree to inform the organizer immediately if I receive a positive test result for COVID-19 within 14 days of leaving the event.
