Fair Hill is a 5,000+ acre multi-purpose Natural Resource Management Area located in the northeast corner of Maryland. MARD has three goals for the weekend: good driving, good friends and good fun with a little education thrown in for good measure! The stables will open at 3:00 pm on Thursday, Sept.8 and close at 3:00 pm on Sunday, Sept. 11. We have 2 barns reserved. Fair Hill has 30-40 miles of carriage-accessible trails, mostly dirt and gravel roads and open meadows. A limited amount of weatherproof trail maps may be available on-site. Please wear your name-tag throughout the event. All carriages must carry a spares kit, which will be checked during the Safety Check. Expiring FLU/RHINO documentation may be sent with registration as long as updated/current documentation is received **prior** to your arrival at MARD.

COMMAND CENTRAL TENT is where food, fun and friends meet throughout the event. Silent Auction takes place here as well as any scheduled speakers.

All whips must be current members of ADS or be assessed the \$15 non-member fee (this fee is included in the non-member costs indicated on registration form) .

Anyone attending MARD under 18 years of age requires the signature of a parent or guardian. Junior drivers (who have not reached their 18th birthday) must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult horseman at all times. Juniors may not drive stallions.

Grooms /assistants must turn 14 years of age by December 31, 2021 and be skilled enough in horsemanship and driving to render assistance.

This event is run on a not-for-profit basis. Fees for food, stabling, and camping on the grounds are the fees the Organizing Committee will pay to the caterers (food) or the Fair Hill NRMA (stabling and camping). The registration fee covers the grounds rental, rental of the tent, tables, chairs, trash removal, other amenities, and organizational costs.

Stalls in the race barns are box stalls with rubber matted floors. Doors are sturdy, high, open mesh metal. **THE ONLY BEDDING PERMITTED IS STRAW**, which will be provided (one bale per horse). Sunday stall cleaning service will be provided on a paid basis; details on registration form. Other types of bedding are not allowed and can not be placed in manure pile. If this presents a veterinary problem for your animal(s), contact Organizer *prior to arrival* so a special permit can be authorized; **you MUST empty your stall of all vet approved bedding before departure!** Short of a major rain/wind storm, the barn roof overhang will provide reasonable protection for a tack box and some other equipment. There is no covered storage for carriages. The roof overhang on the barns offers only limited cover. Bring a tarp to cover your vehicle overnight (also good for stall clean-out) or store in your trailer to protect it from the weather.

If you live close to Fair Hill, you are welcome to pay the weekend or day registration fee and trailer in. However, all equines (minis included) staying on the grounds overnight must be in an individual stall.

Fair Hill is a multi-use, public land facility. Therefore, we will not have exclusive use of the entire facility for the weekend. Although horses have right-of-way, other people including hikers, bikers, and riders are likely to be on the property, especially if the weather is nice.

FAIR HILL GROUND RULES: NOTHING IS TO BE NAILED, SCREWED OR OTHERWISE ATTACHED TO THE OUTER WALLS OF THE BARN *OR TO THE STALL WALLS*. PLAN ACCORDINGLY!

Novices are welcome and encouraged to attend this event but you and your horse(s) should be sufficiently schooled to handle open spaces and you and your horse(s) should be traffic-safe. When you are not driving, there will be ample opportunity for you to learn more about your horse, your harness, your carriage, etc.

ATTENTION COACH DOGS: FAIR HILL HAS VERY STRICT LEASH RULES FOR DOGS. Dogs must be leashed at all times on the grounds unless they are in/on a vehicle. THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS EVEN FOR THE BEST BEHAVED DOG IN THE WORLD. Park Rangers are authorized to issue tickets to owners who allow their dogs to run/walk off leash.

Nuisance barkers may be asked to leave.

Fair Hill does not allow alcohol on the grounds without a county permit. The organizing committee has secured permits for the tent on Thursday, Friday and Saturday night for those participants who would like to BYO beer or wine.

Please do not consume or possess alcoholic beverages at any other times or places (including the barns and the camp sites) on the Fair Hill grounds during the weekend.

The organizers place a premium on safety. Your vehicle and harness must be in safe condition. As the terrain at Fair Hill can be quite rugged, we **DO NOT** recommend light-duty pneumatic or wire-spoke wheel vehicles.

ALL DRIVERS AND PASSENGERS ARE ENCOURAGED TO WEAR PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR; all junior drivers **MUST** wear protective headgear meeting United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) recommendations. All carriages must carry a **spares kit**, which will be checked during the Safety Check. Slow vehicle signs should be on all carriages; bicycle flag may also be added. We also strongly recommend each person on your carriage wear an **ADS medical armband** that provides specifics on an individual's medical situation in case of an emergency. AWARDING POINTS FOR HIGH POINT TROPHIES

Points at the Nashoba Carriage Classic are awarded in accordance with a weighted scoring system. The weighted system is used to fairly distribute points to competitors with the most competition in a given class. A competitor winning a class with fewer entries will not be awarded the same number of points as someone competing in a class with six or more entries.

Show management reserves the right to drop or combine divisions/classes when entries warrant.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

Class Size: Three entries constitute a class. In the event there are two or fewer entries per class, management reserves the right to combine or cancel any class. Management reserves the right to add or divide any class, or make any changes required by circumstances.

Horse & Pony Size: Horses over 14.2 hands (58" / 147cm) in height will be classified as horses; those 14.2 hands and under will be classified as ponies. Exception: A registered horse of a breed permitting horses to be 14.2 or under (e.g., Arabian, Morgan, Quarter Horse) may show in either division but only one size division at the same show (i.e., as a pony or a horse). If an equine is under 14.2 hands but also eligible to compete in the Horse Division (e.g., Gypsy Vanner, Haflinger, and Fell Pony), it does not qualify to compete in the Draft Horse Division.

Multiple Entries: Horses and ponies used in multiple turnouts may also be driven singly. The same turnout may be driven in more than one division without altering the course.

Junior Drivers: Juniors must not have reached their 18th birthday as of December 31st of this year. Junior drivers must wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet in all classes. Junior drivers under 14 must be accompanied by an adult who is a knowledgeable driver. The same turnout may be driven by both a junior driver and an adult. Juniors must wear helmets in all classes.

Wire Wheel and Pneumatic Tired-Vehicles are permitted.

Grooms/Passengers: A groom is optional for all single turnouts at all times at the event location except for turnouts with an equine 120 cm or taller competing in the Driving Derby. Four-in-hands and unicorns are required to have two grooms or passengers on the vehicle to assist in the event of difficulty. Pairs or tandems are required to carry one groom.

Dress/Harness: Drivers and passengers will be dressed conservatively according to the style of their vehicle for pleasure driving classes. No period costumes unless specifically called for. Driving aprons or lap robes, hats, gloves, and driving whip are required while driving in all classes (unless waived by the judge). Martingales and overchecks are prohibited in obstacle classes for all vehicles. **Helmets are strongly encouraged for all classes but mandatory for juniors (17 and under) and for anyone participating in the Driving Derby!**

Vehicles: Entrants may use more than one vehicle for nonchampionship classes. However, for division championships, an entry is defined as the driver, the equine(s), and the vehicle; any change in the above within a division requires the turnout to carry a different number.

Important: Release Waivers must be signed for all passengers.

One or more rounds over a course consisting of pairs of cones and marathon-type obstacles. Width measurement of obstacles will be at least 2 meters. A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted to seconds. Total time determines placings and the lowest time wins. The times plus penalty scores for multiple rounds are added to produce final scores and placings. Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty points, a drive-off, or may remain at management discretion.

An equine may compete no more than three rounds in a single day.

Course: All competitors will do Gates A, B, C, D.

Eligibility: Competition is open to equines and athletes in all divisions. Classes may consist of VSE, Small Pony, Large Pony, & Horse turned out as singles, pairs, tandems, unicorns, and four-in-hands. Classes may be combined at Organizer's discretion.

Carriage: Marathon-type carriage with iron or solid-rubber tires is encouraged. There are no required weights or track widths. Harness: Bridle must have noseband. No type of check or auxiliary reins is allowed. Breeching is required for all single turnouts and for any vehicle without brakes.

Safety: All Athletes and groom(s) must wear securely fastened protective headgear which meets ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use. Safety (protective) vests are required for all drivers and navigators.

Groom(s):

- a. Singles, pairs and tandems: One groom required at all times except single VSE and single Small Pony.
- b. Unicorns and four-in-hands: Two grooms at all times except VSE, which is only required one groom.

PLEASURE SHOW/CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

Turnout: A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged:

- 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, spurs and appointments, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression.
- 30% on performance, manners and way of going.

Timed Obstacles: To be driven over a prescribed course of 14-18 obstacles. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the finish line. Faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Places are determined by low time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive off. Standard width measurement of obstacles will be in meters: Pairs & Multiples 2.0, Horse 2.0, Pony 1.8, VSE 1.5.

Working: A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot (Draft Horse Division—walk, slow trot, and working trot). Entries will be required to stand quietly and rein back. All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the judge, and may be asked to execute a figure eight. To be judged: 70% on performance, manners, and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; and 10% on neatness of attire.

Reinsmanship: A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. Drivers shall be required to rein back. All drivers chosen for a workout may be worked at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests. The driver should be seated comfortably on the box so as to be relaxed and effective. Either the one or two-handed method of driving is acceptable. Common to both methods, the elbows and arms should be close to the body with an allowing but steady hand enabling a consistent "feel" with the horse's mouth. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one general style over another. To be judged: 75% on handling of reins and whip, control, posture, and overall impression of driver; 25% on the condition of harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.

Fault and Out: A timed course of numbered obstacles to be driven at the trot. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area and not to exceed 10 obstacles. After passing through the start markers, the driver proceeds through each consecutively numbered obstacle, in order, until the allowed time expires (suggested time, 90 seconds to two minutes), or until an obstacle is dislodged or a disobedience occurs. If all the obstacles are driven cleanly before the allowed time expires, the driver will begin the course again, starting with obstacle #1, without having to pass through the Start markers. (However, passing through the Start markers more than once is not considered "off course" and is not penalized.) Two points will be scored for each obstacle cleared before the allowed a disobedience occurs, or an obstacle is dislodged. When the allowed time expires, a disobedience occurs, or an obstacle is dislodged, a signal will be given. The driver then proceeds through the next consecutively numbered obstacle. The time will be taken when the rear axle clears this obstacle. If that obstacle is cleared, one Pleasure Driving point is scored.

PLEASURE SHOW (CONTINUED)

If it is dislodged, no points for that dislodged obstacle are scored, but the time is still taken. The score of a driver who fails to drive the next consecutively numbered obstacle after the whistle is blown counts, up to the point where the signal is given, but the competitor must be placed after those with an equal score and time. Placings will be determined by the greatest number of points. Standard width measurement of obstacles will be in meters: Pairs & Multiples 2.0, Horse 2.0, Pony 1.8, VSE 1.5.

NASHOBA FAVORITES (Nashoba Favorites do not count toward high point trophies.)

Carriage Dog: A fun class for you and your other four-legged friend. The dog may ride in the vehicle, either standing, sitting or lying down. He should be quiet, well behaved and appear to enjoy the ride. The dog may wear a leash but the dog must not be tied to the driver, passengers or to the vehicle. The dog may be held by a passenger in their lap or by a leash.

Astride, Aside, Afoot, or on the Box Costume Parade Class: A class for everyone! No horse required; dogs are allowed but must be on a leash if on foot, or be on the carriage. You may even bring your stick horse! All participants must be in costume. Prizes will be awarded for originality and creativity. Please remember that juniors must wear helmets in all classes.

Picnic Class: To be judged only on the presentation of the driver's picnic display. While the entry will not be judged on the ability to fit all tables/chairs/acoutrements on the carriage, the spread should be in good taste and balanced with the carriage. Formal judging will take place at 4:00, and the People's Choice judging will take place through the conclusion of the Driving Derby.

Drive and Ride: The Drive and Ride Class is conducted according to Nashoba Carriage Classic House Rules, which state that the Drive and Ride Class has two sections that are pinned separately: Walk/Trot (Class 44.1) and Walk/Trot/Canter (Class 44.2).

All entries in the Drive and Ride Class are judged concurrently during the Driving segment of the class but pinned separately according to which section each entry has entered: Walk/Trot or Walk/Trot/Canter. Each entry must designate either Class 44.1 or Class 44.2, and entries may not cross enter into both sections.

All entries in Class 44.1 and Class 44.2 complete the Driving segment concurrently. After the Driving segment is completed, carriages will be removed from the ring and all entries complete the Walk/Trot portion of the Riding segment concurrently. After all entries have performed at the walk and the trot, the Walk/Trot entries come to the center of the ring and the Walk/Trot/Canter entries perform at the canter. Entries must line up separately according to their class number.

All riders and all juniors must wear ASTM/SEI approved helmets. To be judged:

- 50% on performance, manners, way of going and suitability in harness.
- 50% on performance, manners, and way of going under saddle.

Magnolia Drive: To be driven over 3-5k of lovely wooded trails through Germantown woods and neighboring estates. Course simulates a Sunday country drive, and includes small hills and easy terrain. Drive is not timed. Excessive speed is penalized. Entries must pass the spares and safety check before going on course. Grooms/passengers encouraged, but not required with single pony or horse. Magnolia Drive is judged on Working Class Standards (general manners, way of going, suitability of equine for the task, and overall impression) with first through sixth place ribbons. During the Magnolia Drive, Poker Cards will be given. One award for the Highest-Ranking Hand (per Poker Rules) will also be awarded. Sidesaddle is judged separately. The judge will be on the course.

PLEASURE SHOW (CONTINUED)

SIDESADDLE CLASSES

The Sidesaddle Division highlights the tradition and versatility of the seat. Turnouts may be English (Walk, Trot, Canter), Western (Walk, Jog, Lope), Gaited (Walk, Intermediate Gait, Forward Gait), or Period. Appointments should be appropriate to that seat with an overall appearance of good taste and balance.

Divisions: Walk-Trot/Forward Gait (marked with *) and Walk-Trot/Forward Gait, Canter (marked with +). A horse or pony may enter any of the sidesaddle classes. In order to be eligible for a division, the horse or pony must enter ALL three of the designated classes.

- To be eligible for the Walk/Trot Division Championship, entries must be entered in classes 40.1, 41.1, and 45, and cannot enter the 18" Hunter Hack.
- To be eligible for the Walk/Trot/Canter Division Championship, entries must be entered in classes: 42.2, 43.2 and 46
- A Walk/Trot Division rider may enter Class 42.1 and Class 43.1. A Walk/Trot Division rider may not enter Class 46.
- A WTC Division rider may enter Class 40.2, Class 41.2 and Class 45.

Class Numbers: The following classes are to be run concurrently and pinned separately:

40.1 and 40.2
41.1 and 41.2
42.1 and 42.2
43.1 and 43.2

A rider may not cross enter between divisions in classes that are run concurrently.

Open Pleasure: Manners and suitability as a pleasure mount are paramount. Transitions from one gait to another should be smooth and effortless. Horses must be obedient with prompt transitions. Entries should not exhibit extreme motion, speed, or resistance of any type. Horses must stand quietly and back readily in the line-up. Judge may ask for a walk, seated trot, or canter (or corresponding gait for Western, Gaited, or Period entries).

PLEASURE SHOW (CONTINUED)

Open Equitation: The rider adopts a correct position showing suppleness and straightness and is balance with the horse/pony. The rider has a secure seat independent of reins, and applies correct aids unobtrusively and effectively, avoiding unnecessary movement. The horse should move freely forward in a consistent rhythm, be calm, relaxed and obedient to the aids and remain still when halted. Judge may ask for a walk, seated trot, or canter (or corresponding gait for Western, Gaited, or Period entries). The judge may ask the riders questions or select at least one-fourth of the class to work-off at the appropriate gaits (no dismounting).

Command Class: To be judged 100% on the ability of the rider to complete the judge's requests. The judge will call out a series of commands to the participants, with gaits not exceeding a trot. They may include figure 8, turn on the forehand, turn on the haunches, sidepass, rein back. Participants should be able to start the command within six steps. The judge may call any other command out to "eliminate" the participants or to judge their places in the class. Volunteers will act as "spotters" to help the judge.

Hunter Hack 18": To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Judges may ask for a hand gallop but no more than eight to hand gallop at one time. To jump two fences at 18". To be judged on performance and soundness with an emphasis on manners. Under Saddle performance to count 50%, Over Fences performance to count 50%.

Temperatures should be in the 80's during the day and upper 50's-low 60's at night. Historically, rain is unlikely. Show Day Start Time is 8am / or 9am, TBD after close of Entry, and competitors notified. Afternoon classes should finish by 5pm., and perhaps earlier on Sunday.

After checking in, competitors may practice in the warm up ring if they desire. Those not stabling are welcome to trailer-in for practice on Friday, but please check-in before doing so, and add a Fri. "show from trailer fee" to the entry.

Recognition: *The Festival of Driving is recognized by the American Driving Society and every class offered herein which is covered by the current rules and specifications of the Society will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.*

The ADS Rule Book is available on the [ADS website](#) (Use the Rule Book link in the footer, and then the link on that page.) See the "PD" pages section. All competitors are encouraged to become familiar with the Pleasure Driving Rules.

Membership in the American Driving Society is required of all drivers, along with a \$5 "competition" fee, OR a non-member must fill out a Non-Member Credit Voucher Form and pay a \$30 fee in order to participate. A link to the Non-member Form is available next to the Entry Form link on our website, as well as an Affidavit Form that must be filled out by anyone who is a current ADS member but cannot fill in their membership number on the entry form. Include the non-member fee, or the member competition fee, on the entry form. This fee is per driver, not per entry. Pay it only one time if you have more than one entry. Membership in the Arizona Driving and Carriage Society is not required. Please note that the Show liability insurance, through ADS, covers only ADS members, officials, organizers and volunteers at the event. Anyone paying the non-member fee will receive a copy of the form which is a \$30 voucher towards ADS membership in the future. These fees are waived for Junior Drivers. See "Show Fees" on page 3. The Non-Member and Affidavit Forms are also on pages 13 and 14.

WestWorld and ADS Site Entry Requirements: A negative Coggins within 12 months of the show date is required for any equine entering the facility. Out of State equine also require a current Health Certificate, dated within the previous 30 days. Proof of vaccination is needed for Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within the 6 months prior to entering the venue. Show your documentation at Check-in, or include copies with your entry. See the ADS website for descriptions of accepted forms of vaccine documentation. Please READ and become familiar with all the WestWorld Facility Rules at the end of this document.

Ribbons/Prizes: Ribbons are awarded through 6 places in each class, with an additional prize to first place. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons are awarded in each Division, and a Buckle to the Champion of each Division. See the Division information and required minimum number of classes to qualify in each division on page 6.

Signing of Liability Waiver Form: The Driver (parent or legal guardian of a minor), equine owner, and all others in the party that may ride on the carriage or handle the equine at this event must sign the waiver. The Driver should sign it on the entry Form, and all others who may not have access to the Entry form at the time of entry, may sign and submit an online version of the Waiver. A link to the form is on the Festival Page on the ADCS website or use this [link](#). Online submission is the preferred method in order to reduce personal contact at the show and avoid delays when checking in. Waivers can be submitted until Oct. 26th, after that, sign on site.

The ADS COVID Mitigation Plan: Please see Page 6 for more information on the ADS Covid-19 mitigation, and any local rules.

Divisions Offered:

- Single VSE, *any vehicle
- Single Small Pony, *any vehicle
- Single Pony, Pleasure Vehicle
- Single Horse, Pleasure Vehicle
- Pair/Multiples, Pleasure Vehicle - *except VSE or Small Ponies in the class may use any safe vehicle
- Utility/Marathon Vehicle, all hitches
- Junior to Drive*

* This exception is made for VSE and Small Ponies as "pleasure show" vehicles are less common for small equine, but attempts should be made to add typical pleasure appointments. Vehicles that are very different in style than pleasure vehicles (hyper bike, stage coach, fire engine, fore cart, commercial vehicle) might be better suited to be in the Utility/Marathon Division, and would probably place higher than they would in the VSE or Small Pony classes. Also, Juniors entering classes in the Junior to Drive Division, are not limited to a pleasure show vehicle.

Please note that drafts/draft crosses, mules and donkeys are welcome at this show. They should enter divisions/classes appropriate for the equine size, type of hitch and vehicle, or other designations for some classes. See the **Divisions Section** for specifics on each division.

Classes Offered:

Division Classes include: Turnout, Working, and Reinsmanship; Obstacles classes of Progressive Cones, Fault and Out, and Reverse Psychology.

Non-Division / Specialty Classes include: Ladies' Driving Class, Gentlemen's Driving Class, AARP, Working-Maiden Driver, Working-Green Equine, Red Hat Class, and Carriage Dog Class. All classes are described in detail later in this document.

Stable on site or Show from Trailer: We encourage use of the barn as day parking near our arenas is very limited. If not stabling, there is a daily **show from trailer fee**, with parking assigned in a specified day use only area. **Stalls:** Permanent 10 X 12 box stalls are available for this show in Barn H, closest to our show arenas. One horse per stall, with the exception that two VSE may share a stall if they get along. **2 bags of WestWorld shavings** are required in each horse stall, to be purchased at the Feed and Bedding Office @ \$12.00/bag after taxes. If you want them to be at your stall when you arrive, call the Feed and Bedding Office prior to the show, and order and pay for your shavings and request pre-bedding. We will provide them a stall chart in the week of the show so they will know where to deliver them. You can mention it is for the Carriage Show and we will be in Barn H. If you wait until after you arrive to purchase shavings, you may wait considerable time for them to be delivered. Call 480-312-6814 any time after you enter and by at least Monday before the show to insure pre-bedding. **You may not bring your own shavings.**

Tack Stalls: There is room in the barn aisle for your carriage, but a tack stall is recommended for your harness and other equipment (bring your own padlock) because after unloading, your horse trailer must be parked in Lot M, which is not close. If you are overnighting in your trailer, it must be parked in an RV lot. See next paragraph. Tack stalls can be shared.

Stall assignments and Show from Trailer parking assignments will be sent out to competitors after the entry deadline.

Overnight / RV Camping: Overnighting on site is possible and requires that you use an RV space. Water and electric is available and included in the camping fee, whether you use them or not. If planning to stay overnight in your horse trailer, it must be parked in one of the RV lots, and you must pay the RV fee which is less than \$40 including tax, per night. **You must call WestWorld to reserve and pay for a space.** (You may be able to take care of getting a space on your arrival day, but probably best to call and check on that.) RV Lot L, is closest to our arenas, but larger rigs will not fit there. Know your total length of RV/trailer and tow vehicle, when requesting a space, so you can be assigned an RV lot to accommodate you. The RV Office phone number is 480-312-6802. That office is typically open from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm. Check in at the RV Office after unloading at the barn.

Saturday Evening Silent Auction/Social Gathering: Silent Auction items will be on display by the show office all day Saturday for bidding. At 6pm on Saturday, competitors and volunteers are encouraged to gather for a social opportunity and appetizers/snacks provided by ADCS. Bring a chair. This will be the last opportunity to bid on the auction items. Winners will be announced and your money gladly accepted. Anyone bidding earlier in the day, but missing the "Gathering," should check on Sunday to see if they had the winning bid and can pay for and pick up items then.

Donations for the Silent Auction are gladly accepted. It will be helpful if you let us know ahead of time if you are bringing an auction item, and what it is. Items can be left at the Secretary's Office at check in. We would like to be able to show pictures of all the items in an album on our FaceBook page. Email a picture and description of the item and approximate value to Marcia Fetherston at adcssecretary@gmail.com and she will take care of posting your item.

Onsite Food Vendors: As far as we know at this time, there will be few, if any, food vendors on site. We will send out more information on this closer to the show, if we find out a vendor is available. Plan to supply your own food and water, or go offsite.

2) ENTER ONLINE & PAY ONLINE: Go to the Festival Show page on www.arizonacarriage.org and click on the "Online Enter Form." Fill it out and submit it, following the directions on that page. **Online payments have non-refundable processing and transaction fees.** Early Entry and payment must be submitted by **Oct. 13th**. After that, and until Oct. 21, a **\$30 Late Fee** applies.

For all methods of Entry: **Oct. 21st** is the last day a late online or mailed entry will be accepted, and entries arriving that late may not be in time to have their information included in the Show Program. **No new Entries will be possible on Show Days, but those pre-entered may add classes.**

SHOW FEES INCLUDED ON ENTRY FORM

ADS Competition Fee OR Non-ADS Member Fee: A "Competition fee" of \$5 is to be paid by any driver who is an ADS current member (enter ADS # on the entry), **OR** a Non-Member Form must be filled out and a \$30 fee included with the Entry.

EXCEPTION: These fees are waived for any Junior Driver attending this show. The ADS number must still be listed, or the Non-Member Form submitted, but ADCS will pay these fees for the Juniors.

Office Fee: First entry for a driver is \$15. **An additional entry turnout for the SAME driver** is \$5.

Class fees: All classes are \$20 each, pre-entered or added at the Show. **Exception:** If you pre-enter six or more classes, you may add an additional class free of charge; that class must be included on your entry form.

Trailer-in Fee/Show from Trailer: (if you do not order a stall) \$10 per day **per trailer**, and includes Friday if you come that afternoon to practice. Two entries sharing a trailer pay one haul in fee; be sure to specify on your entry who you trailered with if you do not pay this fee for your entry. Two entries for the same driver showing from trailer, pay this fee for only one of your entries.

Stall Fees: The first day or part of a day of use includes a stall fee and a final cleaning fee (you do not have to strip your stall when you leave) @ \$40 per stall. A "day" at WestWorld is a 24 hour period from 6 am one day to 6 am the next morning. Each additional day or part of a day is \$20 more. Tack stalls are at the same price. Include any tack stall along with your horse stall(s). You may want to find others to share a tack stall with. If sharing, do not include a tack stall with your stall order if someone else is ordering and paying for the shared tack stall. Be sure to indicate on your entry the # of Tack stalls and # of Horse stalls, if any, that you order.

Online Processing Fees - if you **enter and pay online** through our website, you will be charged a **non-refundable transaction/processing fee**. The payment can be via a debit or credit card, or a PayPal account, if you have one. Payments are processed through PayPal. Once your entry is submitted, those added fees cannot be returned, even if the show should be canceled. The total added fees are variable, based on the amount of your Grand Total (approx. 36 cents per \$10 in fees + 51 cents per entry submission)

Note: Save money by mailing your entry.

DEFINITIONS / ATTIRE / VEHICLES AND LOCAL RULES

Motorized Vehicle Notice:

At any ADS-recognized event, minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the jurisdiction in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind (including, but not limited to: golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles) at the event location. Minors who have a valid temporary license or learner permit may operate motorized vehicles only when accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), or legal guardian(s) of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.

Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties and/or sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) from the event location for the remainder of the event. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt. **As per ADS Article AC.2.14.**

An Entry, for the purposes of this show, shall be a horse(s), a driver, **and** a specific vehicle combination. Exception: Changing vehicles, to go in the Antique Carriage Class, will not require a different entry number. Changing vehicles for any other classes will constitute a **different entry** and will require another entry form, entry number and any associated entry fees.

Junior and Adult Drivers are defined as follows (ADS Article 2.7):

Junior and adult competition participants, e.g., anyone who rides on a vehicle at any time at an event, are defined as follows:

- a. The "competition age" of an individual will be the age reached during the current calendar year.
- b. Junior "A" competition age: 10 and below. Junior A drivers must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult horseman at all times.
- c. Junior "B" competition age: 11, 12, 13. Junior B drivers must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult horseman at all times.
EXCEPTION: Junior "B" drivers competing with a single Very Small Equine (VSE) turnout in a securely enclosed arena need not be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult horseman **unless required by the organizer. Please check on show day.** (This exception, **if allowed at this show**, means that a Junior 11 to 13 years old driving a single VSE could enter the show ring and the warm up ring without the adult, as long as the gates are kept closed. Driving anywhere else on the show grounds, requires the adult to be in the vehicle.)
- d. Junior "C" competition age: 14, 15, 16, 17, 18. Junior C drivers competing with a single horse/pony turnout at their discretion need not carry a groom/passenger **unless required by the competition.**
- e. "Junior" - Unless otherwise defined: Competition age under 19.
- f. "Adult" - Competition age 19 and over.

Juniors must wear ASTM approved and fastened protective headgear at all times while on a vehicle at the show grounds. Juniors may not show stallions.

Maiden Driver is any driver who has never earned a blue ribbon at any previous pleasure show(s) they have attended. In deference to the ADS Rule Book, for THIS show, previous shows include ADS recognized and non-recognized shows, and a blue ribbon earned in a class of one or two entries (not three) does not count as winning a blue ribbon previously.

Equine Age, Class Entry Requirement: All equine entered in this show must be a minimum of 3 years of age. Any equine brought on the grounds during this show must be **registered as an entry in at least one class**. For the safety of all, do not bring an equine "just for training purposes" if they are incapable of actually participating in the class entered. Any unsafe or unruly equine may be required to leave.

Green Equine, for the purposes of this show, are any equine attending this show that have participated in zero or no more than one previous **Pleasure Driving Show**, recognized or not.

Equine Size/Hitch: The following equine sizes will be used, and an **ADS Measurement Card** must be presented for all VSE and Ponies, or they must be measured onsite.

VSE - equine under 39" (99 cm) shod or unshod; Small Pony - all equine 39" to 47" (99 cm-to under 120 cm) shod or unshod; Pony - over 47" (120 cm to 148 cm unshod, or 149 cm shod); Horse - all equine over 149 cm (approx. 14.2 2/3 hands).

A Pair/Multiple is any size of equine hitched with more than one equine (pair, four-up, unicorn, tandem).

Draft/Draft Crosses: Any drafts that attend this show must show in the appropriate equine size class, if specified, and with the usual pleasure or other turnout, just like the horses and ponies. Heel chains must be wrapped or removed. They are expected to exhibit the same gaits as required by the specific class.

Bits/Harness should be of a type allowed by ADS, see Rule Book. Also see the Rule Book for rules relating to side checks, leg wraps, martingales, and overchecks. A throat latch and a full noseband are mandatory. A full noseband is defined as a noseband fully encircling the nose. **For safety reasons, breeching or thimbles are required for any turnout whose vehicle does not have brakes.**

Show Attire: Pleasure shows require formal attire of a style suitable to the type of carriage. That includes a lap robe and gloves, a hard hat or pleasure hat, and a whip must be carried. A hard hat is recommended in the obstacle classes, not required. A hard hat in the pleasure classes will not be penalized. See prior statement regarding Junior Drivers and the required helmet.

Period outfits are not appropriate. Ladies should have long sleeves, slacks or dress; men should wear a suit jacket and tie. Tennis shoes are not appropriate. Formal attire applies to **both** the Pleasure and Obstacle classes.

Drivers of utility and marathon vehicles should dress according to their type/style of vehicle, and the particular class; for example, if in a marathon vehicle and showing in the Utility/Marathon **Turnout Class**, dress should be as for a marathon, with a required groom (unless showing a VSE or small pony), matching shirts, appointments as for a marathon (helmet, safety vest, stop watches) and so forth. No lap robe would be required. More formal pleasure attire would be more appropriate in all other classes.

Vehicles: Any SAFE 2 or 4-wheeled vehicle may be used in any class **unless the class name or description limits the entry.** "Bicycle spoked" wheels and pneumatic tires **are** allowed at this show. A "carriage inspection," by the TD, shall take place if there is any question of the safety of any vehicle, or its appropriateness for a particular class or division.

A Utility /Marathon Vehicle at this Show refers to a marathon vehicle and any other type of cart designed for a specific purpose, **and that is not a usual traditional or contemporary "pleasure" or "show" carriage.** Multi-use vehicles that are also designed with suspension to better negotiate a marathon course, are considered a utility/marathon vehicle for this show. Many Pleasure Shows exclude marathon vehicles all together, as they have a definite advantage in timed obstacle classes when going against an antique or a purely "pleasure show" vehicle. The ADS Rule Book, in the PD section, has descriptions of various carriages, and their appointments, appropriate for pleasure shows. FYI: In general, turnout classes expect the more formal, antique, or modern pleasure type of carriage. This is preferred and rewarded (not required). Working classes place less emphasis on turnout, but all other factors being equal, a more formal or traditional pleasure carriage will usually place above a utility vehicle in a pleasure class.

For this show, all marathon and utility vehicles showing in turnout, working, reinsmanship and obstacle classes must show in those classes in the Marathon/Utility Vehicle Division. **Exceptions:** 1) VSE and Small Pony entries, who are not restricted to a pleasure vehicle in the Single VSE and Single Small Pony Division, or if they show in the Multiples Division; 2) Junior drivers showing in the Junior to Drive Division. See the ***Note** re: small equine vehicles under the Divisions Offered section on page 2. While Junior entries are not restricted to a "pleasure vehicle," a very different or unique vehicle might be better suited in the Utility/Marathon Division, rather than entering the Junior Division.

While possibly at a disadvantage, depending on the judging directives for a specific class, marathon and utility vehicles may show in the non-division / specialty classes **unless restricted by the Class name or description.** The Utility/Marathon Vehicle Division is offered so folks without pleasure show vehicles may participate in several classes without being at a judging disadvantage.

Drafts entering this show should conform to the equine size, pleasure or other turnout recommendations, as specified for each class type.

Wheel Measurement: Measure your wheels **if you will be showing in the obstacle classes.** We will remeasure, on site, any entries in the Progressive Obstacles classes, as we will use the actual track widths to adjust clearances. If that measurement does not include someone in the Sunday Obstacle classes, we want a heads up if there is track width that varies too much from the others in the division. For fairness, adjustments can then be made — as we plan to use set distances on Sunday for horses and ponies of (200 cm), and less for VSE (TBD). It is possible that someone plans to show with a carriage that could be very different, for instance an antique style that is very wide, or a small pony showing with a horse size wheel base cart against a VSE sized cart.

Measure at ground level at the widest wheel track. It is best to place a block or traffic cone on the ground, right next to the outside of each wheel, and then move the carriage and measure the distance between the markers. Indicate cm or in. on the Entry Form in the "Carriage Information" section. Centimeters is preferred, but if you do not have a centimeter measuring tape, then indicate in inches.

Grooms: Any required groom must be at least 14 years of age and capable. Grooms are expected to dress appropriately (it counts when judged), and are required on all pair and multiple hitches, and in the turnout class for a marathon vehicle (if choosing to dress in "marathon" attire), unless the equine is a single VSE or Small Pony.

Walking and Trotting only is allowed at this Pleasure Show, in the rings and on the grounds. Breaks of pace must be immediately corrected or penalties or elimination will result. (See ADS Rule Book for penalties.)

Show/Warm-up Ring: The Show Ring is the north ring (Ring 6), and NO PRACTICE is allowed in that ring at any time on any day. No lunging is allowed in the Warm-up/on deck ring, (Ring 7) for safety.

Dogs - All dogs brought on the grounds must be leashed or restrained at all times; exception is while entered in the carriage dog class, and in that class, **all dogs must ride on the carriage.** They may not run on the ground by the carriage. Pick up after your dog. See reference to dogs in WestWorld Rules. Dogs are not allowed in the food vendor areas.

Conflicts, Gate Holds and Tack Changes: After the final gate call for a Pleasure Class, any entry not yet in the ring will have no more than **90 seconds** to report to that ring. Once the gate is closed, it will be considered a MISSED CLASS for that entry. Anyone who has a tack change that could interfere with a gate call, should notify the Show Secretary at check-in, and the appropriate gate person in advance of the call for the class. Maximum tack change time limit is 10 minutes. Competitors are responsible for staying aware of how the show is progressing. The loud speaker may not be heard if too far away from the Pleasure Ring, and possibly not always at the barn.

ADS COVID Statment: Attention Event Participants & Attendees:

An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, senior citizens and those with underlying medical conditions are especially vulnerable. By attending this ADS Recognized Event, you voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19.

By entering this event, you are confirming that you and all persons in your party:

- Are not experiencing any of the symptoms of COVID-19 identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention at CDC.gov.
- Are not under any self-quarantine orders

PHYSICAL DISTANCING AND MASKS/FACE COVERINGS REQUIREMENTS:

All persons at ADS-Recognized Events are required to follow state and local regulations for masks/face coverings and social distancing. In the absence of state or local regulations, ADS requires compliance with current CDC guidelines.

WHO MUST DISTANCE/MASK: Anyone who is not fully vaccinated* for COVID-19.

WHEN: At all times while indoors, and outdoors when you are within six feet of individuals outside of your household.

EXCEPTIONS:

- Immediate Household Members**
- Essential support personnel assisting an entry preparing to compete, during competition (including riding on the same vehicle) and immediately after competing.
- In cases of emergency.

*Fully Vaccinated – An individual is considered to be fully vaccinated two weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer, Moderna, etc.), or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine (Johnson & Johnson).

**Immediate Household Members – Individuals consistently living in the same house or dwelling. Members of a household may or may not be related.

Online entering and paying is highly recommended, as a means to limit handling of paperwork. FYI, stalls are not sanitized between events, but rather 2 or 3 times during the year. Rest rooms will be sanitized on a daily basis by the facility.

DIVISION INFORMATION

A Champion and Reserve Champion will be named in each Division that has qualifiers. The indicated minimum number of classes for each division must be entered to qualify for the championship. Reinsmanship is required in all divisions and is the tie breaker class for the Championship. A tie for Reserve may be decided by a coin toss if all parties agree. The same vehicle is to be used by an entry number in each of his/her division classes.

Cross entering Division Classes: An entry is allowed to enter some Division classes in more than one Division, if they are eligible; example, a Junior driving a VSE could go in the VSE Division classes and the Junior Division classes. **But only the Division chosen for the Obstacle classes would count towards a Championship, as an Obstacles class type** (like Fault and Out) **may be entered only ONE time with the same equine.** Entering the same type class more than once would constitute “practice,” since the course stays the same, and this is not allowed. Therefore, only the Obstacle classes within the Division chosen for Division Championship consideration should be entered. The only exception for an equine to enter the same type of Obstacle class more than one time, is if the equine is shown as part of a multiple hitch and also as a single entry. Anyone cross entering the pleasure classes in more than one Division may be placed in any of those classes, but championship points will accumulate only in the Division chosen for Obstacle classes.

Divisions Offered:

- 1) **Single VSE.** Classes that Count: 2, 5, 21, 33, 38, 45
- 2) **Single Small Pony.** Classes that Count: 7, 10, 22, 35, 39, 46
- 3) **Single Pony, Pleasure vehicle.** Classes that Count: 3, 6, 24, 34, 41, 47
- 4) **Single Horse, Pleasure vehicle.** Classes that Count: 1, 4, 25, 32, 42, 48
- 5) **Pair/Multiples, all size equines, Pleasure vehicle required except for VSE/Sm Equine.** Classes that Count: 9, 12, 26, 37, 43, 49
- 6) **Utility/Marathon Vehicle, any hitch.** Classes that Count: 8, 11, 27, 36, 44, 50

The classes offered in the divisions above include Turnout, Working, Reinsmanship, Progressive Obstacles, Fault and Out Obstacles, and Reverse Psychology Obstacles. To qualify for the Division Championship, at least five of the six classes must be entered, and the Reinsmanship class is required, as it is the tie breaker class.

7) **Junior to Drive:** Classes to count: 13, 15, 23, 31, 40

Classes offered include Turnout, Working, Reinsmanship, Progressive Obstacles, and Fault and Out Obstacles. To qualify for the Division Championship, at least four of the five classes must be entered. Reinsmanship class is required, as it is the tie breaker class.

Method of Awarding Points for Division Awards: Placement (1st through 6th) in the classes in the chosen Division will earn points toward the Championship for an entry (horse/driver/carriage combination). In classes of six or more, 1st place earns six points, and each place after through 6th earns one point less. In classes with fewer than six entries, 1st place earns points equal to the number in the class, and each place after that earns one less point.

Any tie for a Division Championship will be broken by the Reinsmanship Class results in that division, with the Championship going to the competitor with the better placement in that class.

A Points Chart for each Division will be posted at the Show Office and updated after every class that applies. Division ribbons and awards will be awarded after Class ribbons for the last class in each Division, if possible, or at the Show Office. Check before leaving the show if you believe you may have earned 1st or 2nd in your Division, and ribbons were not presented in the ring.

DETAILED CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Description of Rail Classes:

Large classes could be split, with a work off for final placement. Class Ribbons will be awarded while in the ring. The winner, who will also be given Prize voucher, can redeem the 1st place prize in the Show Office during the day.

Turnout Classes - A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. All class entries are in the ring at the same time. Ribbons are presented in the ring at the end of the class. The turnout classes are designated for a specific equine size, driver, or carriage type. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged: 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, spares and appointments, neatness and appropriateness of attire, and overall impression; 30% on performance, manners and way of going. Please see the notes regarding attire and vehicles that relate to Turnout Classes on Page 4 and 5.

Offered Turnout Classes for all Divisions: 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, 9, 13

Working Classes - A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive. All class entries are in the ring at the same time. Ribbons are presented in the ring at the end of the class. The working classes are shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. Required also to stand quietly both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back. All entries chosen for a work off may be worked both ways of the arena at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests. To be judged: 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s); 20% on the condition, fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire.

Offered Working Classes for all Divisions: 4, 5, 6, 10, 11, 12, 15 Other Working classes include: Class 19 - Maiden Driver; and Class 20 - Green Equine.

Reinsmanship Classes - A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver. All entries are in the ring at the same time. Ribbons are presented in the ring at the end of the class. The Reinsmanship classes are shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. Drivers are required to rein back. All drivers chosen for a workout may be worked at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests. The driver should be seated comfortably on the box so as to be relaxed and effective. Either a one-handed or two-handed method of driving is acceptable. Common to both methods, the elbows and arms should be close to the body with an allowing but steady hand enabling a consistent "feel" with the horse's mouth. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one general style over another. To be judged: 75% on handling of reins and whip, control, posture, and overall impression of driver. 25% on the condition of harness and neatness of attire. **Offered Reinsmanship Classes for all Divisions:** 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37

Non-Division, Specialty and Local Rail Classes:

Ladies' or Gentlemen's Driving Class - Entries are limited to ladies only or gentlemen only and judged primarily on the suitability of the turnout for a lady (or gentleman), with emphasis on manners. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. Must rein back without resistance and must stand quietly at any location in the arena. To be judged: 50% on manners, performance, elegance and suitability of the turnout for a lady (manners, performance and suitability for a gentleman; gentlemen may show a degree of boldness but not excessive speed); 25% on skill of the driver; 25% on overall impression.

Offered Classes: Class 14 - Gentlemen's Driving Class, and Class 18 - Ladies' Driving Class

AARP – These classes are limited to horse and driver combinations with a combined age of 65 years or greater. In a multiple hitch, only the age of the oldest horse is counted. All class entries are in the ring at the same time. Ribbons are presented in the ring at the end of the class. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, and a working trot. Required also to stand quietly both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back. The combined age of the turnout may contribute, in part, to the outcome; however, the class will not be placed solely on the combined age. Entries will be asked for their combined age by the gate steward, as they enter the ring. To be Judged: 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s); 20% on the condition, fit of harness and vehicle, and on neatness of attire; 10% on combined age of Horse and Driver.

Offered AARP Classes: Class 16 - Horse/Pony, any hitch. Class 17 - VSE and Small Pony, any hitch

Antique Carriage Class - A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the quality of each turnout. Limited to antique vehicles (not reproduction or modern vehicles), pleasure or other type (ex: Doctor's buggy) considered to be an antique. Dress would be appropriate to the vehicle. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot and working trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. Performance will not be judged unless it detracts from overall impression. Vehicle and harness may be inspected to ensure thoughtful restoration and careful maintenance. To be judged: 75% on Vehicle and appropriateness of harness, neatness of attire and overall impression; 25% on condition of vehicle and harness. **Offered:** Class 28 - Antique Carriage Class Open

Red Hat Class - To be judged on the best RED Hat in the class. Class may be entered by men and women. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot; to stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged: 75% on the Red Hat and neatness of attire and overall impression; 25% on the way of going of the horse(s); performance will not be judged unless it detracts from overall impression. **Offered:** Class 29 - Red Hat Class.

Carriage Dog Class - Judged primarily on suitability of the dog to serve as a companion (maximum one dog per vehicle). To be judged both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot and working trot. The dog should be standing, lying down or seated on the vehicle. **For safety concerns and due to facility rules and ADS guidelines, no dog may be running on the ground.** The dog must be under control at all times. The dog must not be restrained by being tied to the vehicle, driver or passenger. The driver should not hold the dog, and the dog should not interfere with the driver in any way. The dog may be of any breed. To be judged: 60% on the suitability of the dog as a companion; 30% on the performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s); 10% on the overall impression of the turnout, including the dog. Entries with a dog not clearly under control may be eliminated. **Offered:** Class 30 - Carriage Dog Open.

Description of Pleasure Obstacle Classes

NOTE: ALL OBSTACLE CLASSES ARE WALK/TROT ONLY. An equine may not enter the same type of Obstacle class more than one time except as a single and again as part of a pair/multiple hitch (different entries). Therefore, there is no cross entering of division obstacle classes allowed by the same entry.

Attire /Procedures: Pleasure show attire (including a lap robe) applies to all Obstacle classes. A salute is not required, but be sure to wait for the signal to start your course. Course diagrams will be posted at the Show Office the first day of the show and/or will be included in the Show Program. On Saturday, Progressive Obstacles will be set up in the main ring as soon as the last rail class is finished. The course should be available to "walk" for a short period prior to a class being called. Sunday, the Fault and Out Obstacle Class will be set up in the main ring after the Reinsmanship classes, for walking during lunch. Hopefully, the second obstacle class on Sunday can be walked during a break, whose length may depend on the lateness of the day at that point.

Obstacle class ribbons will be presented in the ring after the last go for a Division. Class competitors should remain in the area outside the ring gate and listen for the announcement to re-enter the ring for class placement.

Any TIES in PLACING in the Obstacles classes will be broken by a coin toss or drive off at the judge's discretion.

Progressive Obstacle Classes - To be driven at the trot over a course of six numbered obstacles which will be adjusted to the following clearances: #1 – 51 cm, #2 – 41 cm, #3 – 30, #4 – 20 cm, #5 – 10 cm, #6 – 5 cm. After passing the starting line, the entry proceeds through each obstacle, in order, until finishing the course or dislodging an obstacle.

Scoring:

- Time to be recorded when an obstacle is dislodged or when the rear axle clears Obstacle #6. Points accumulated to that point count.
- For a disobedience or for going off course, points accumulated to that point count; however, no time will be recorded.
- Two points given for each set of obstacles cleared. No points given for dislodged obstacles.
- Placings determined on a high-point basis. Placings determined by points in descending order, with ties in points broken by fastest time.
- Entries with accumulated points and no recorded time are placed after those with equal points and recorded times.

Penalties:

Dislodging an obstacle - Accumulated points and time recorded to that point

Break in gait (to canter or walk) - Accumulated points and time recorded to that point

Disobedience - Accumulated points count, no time recorded

Off course - Accumulated points count, no time recorded

Groom(s) dismounting - Accumulated points count, no time recorded

Offered Progressive Obstacle Classes for all Divisions: 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27. To be run by an order of go posted at the Show Office - and based on track width measurements shortest to longest.

Fault and Out Obstacle Classes - A timed course of numbered obstacles, not to exceed 10, to be driven at a trot. Obstacle clearance for horses and ponies is a set distance of 80 inches (200 cm). Distance will be less for VSE (TBD). After passing through the Start markers, the driver shall proceed through each consecutively numbered obstacle, in order, until the allowed time expires (suggested time, 90 seconds to two minutes), or until an obstacle is dislodged or a disobedience occurs. If all the obstacles are driven cleanly before the allowed time expires, the driver will begin the course again, starting with obstacle #1, without having to pass through the Start markers. Passing through the Start markers more than once is not considered "off course" and is not penalized.

Two points will be scored for each obstacle cleared before the allowed time expires, a disobedience occurs or an obstacle is dislodged. When the allowed time expires, a disobedience occurs or an obstacle is dislodged, a signal will be given. **The driver then proceeds through the next consecutively numbered obstacle. The time will be taken when the rear axle clears this obstacle.** If that obstacle is cleared, one point is scored. If it is dislodged, no points for that dislodged obstacle are scored, but the time is still taken. The score of a driver who fails to drive the next consecutively numbered obstacle after the whistle is blown shall count, up to the point where the signal is given, but the competitor must be placed after those with an equal score and time. Placings will be determined by the greatest number of points; ties broken by faster time. Going off course will incur elimination.

Offered Fault and Out Classes: Division Classes 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44. To be run in classes, order of go posted or in Program.

Reverse Psychology Obstacles - To be driven over a prescribed course of 8-10 obstacles (paired markers). After passing through the Start markers, all the obstacles must be driven in the correct sequence. After completing the highest-numbered obstacle, the driver will then turn and drive that obstacle in the reverse direction and continue to drive all the remaining obstacles in reverse order and in the reverse direction and through the Finish markers where timing will stop. Course faults are as listed in Article 246 Penalties, in the Rule Book. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis; ties broken on lower course fault total. Entries may be stopped by a signal from the judge after completing the highest-numbered obstacle to allow dislodged/disturbed obstacles to be rebuilt.

Offered Reverse Psychology Obstacle Division Classes: 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50. To be run in classes, with an order of go posted at the Show Office, if not in the Program.

CLASS SCRATCHES, SUBSTITUTIONS & ADDITIONS, REFUNDS

Competitors are responsible for keeping track of show progress. Conflicts due to tack changes should be reported to the Show Office at check-in (if suspected) and to the gate before the first call for a class.

Day of Show Secretary Contact: For set up day, October 28th, and on the show days, in case you may need to contact the Show Day Secretary, for instance if you have broken down and will be late or are not coming at all, please call 928-379-3070.

Scratching Classes the day of the show: Please notify the **Show Secretary and the appropriate gate person** if you decide to scratch classes the day of the show, as soon as you know and prior to the 1st gate call for that class. This is to avoid holding the gate or repeated calls for an entry that does not intend to show in that class. No notification of a scratch **prior to the gate being closed for that class**, will be considered a **missed class**.

Substituted Classes: An entry may substitute some other class for a scratched class for that **same entry** at no charge, but must add the substituted class at least 2 classes prior to the gate call for the class. There is no free substitution for **missed** classes.

Adding Classes the day of the show: Adds are allowed, but added classes must be processed **AT THE SECRETARY'S Office** a minimum of two classes prior to the gate call for the added class, so there is time to notify the show ring and the gate.

Payment for the added class(es) is required when the class is added, or an **open check** can be left with your first added class, if you think you may add more classes later. Plan ahead. If you try to add a class and do not bring payment or an open check with you, you could be too late to add it after you go back to get your money! If paying cash, try to have the exact amount.

Combined or Canceled Classes: The show organizers reserve the right to combine small, like classes in the same ring and to possibly cancel classes with fewer than two entries.

REFUND POLICY: Note: If show fees were paid online, the transaction/processing fees cannot be returned with a refund. Any refunds could take a week or more to process.

Withdrawal from the Show: (Fees paid to WestWorld for camping or shavings — contact them about their refund policy.)

- **By close of the Early Entry Deadline** of Oct. 13th, which is the online enter deadline and when any mailed entry should have arrived - Refund of all show fees paid, except any online payment transaction/processing fees.
- **By close of Late Entry deadline of Oct. 22,** all show fees refunded except the office fee, banquet fees and any online payment transaction/processing fees.
- **Withdrawal after Oct. 22th,** no refund of any kind; **exception** would be special circumstances decided on a case by case basis, if a refund is requested and the show secretary was notified before Oct. 28. A vet or doctor statement may be required. A “no show” on Show day, no refund of any kind.
- Banquet fees are refundable only if withdrawal is received before the 22nd, as that is the day we must give the caterer our number of meals. After that, no refund unless another buys your ticket(s).

Scratched and Missed Classes:

- Canceled classes by Show Organizers - refund of class fee or free substitution of another class.
- Competitor scratched class, with no substitution class chosen for a replacement - If requested, any refund will be decided case by case depending on having a very good reason for the scratch.
- Missed class - no refund.

See the Show Secretary to settle your fees at the end of the show, if you left an open check, or have payments pending, etc.

On call Farrier: TBD, phone number will be available in the Show Office.

WESTWORLD REQUIREMENTS FOR OUR SHOW

PLEASE READ AND BECOME FAMILIAR WITH THEM

1. Stall cleanings are to be placed only in areas designated by City. Stall cleanings may not be put in any walkway or trash barrel. Signs showing manure drops designate specific areas. Trash is not to be mixed in with manure.

2. The city shall be responsible for the daily pick-up of manure/shavings from stalls that is placed in the designated areas near the barns, **and final manure/shavings clean-up of permanent horse stalls.** (You do not need to strip stalls when you leave.)

Clean-up and removal of all other waste, cartons, trash, decorative materials, **hay, shavings and manure droppings in parking areas** shall be the sole responsibility of the competitor. If City performs the clean-up for the above, City shall charge, at the current posted rates for all labor, supplies and equipment (including dumpsters) necessary to perform said clean-up and removal from property. (Please help us keep our WestWorld charges for this to a minimum. Clean up around your trailer. Bring a trash bag for any hay or droppings and take them home with you, or transport them to the manure bins by the barn.)

3. Basic electrical plug-ins are supplied at each stall. Any person overloading these circuits shall be billed for the labor to reset the circuits.

4. Any pet in stall area must be on leash or secured. No pets are allowed in show ring area. (We are excepted for the carriage dog class.) Absolutely no pets are allowed in arenas or within one hundred (100) feet of any food concession. Owner assumes all liability for pet animals.

5. Wash animals in wash racks only. Do not wash in stalls, bathrooms, walkways, streets or any other area.

6. Absolutely no hot shoeing permitted in stall areas.

7. A negative Coggins, dated within the previous twelve months, must accompany all horses, six months of age and older, brought onto WestWorld property.

8. A Health Certificate, dated within the previous thirty days, must be presented for any horse originating outside of Arizona; Event management shall verify all paperwork.

9. Standing Horses. No horse shall stand outside its trailer past 8:00 p.m. or longer than one hour after the last class or other equestrian event in which the horse was a participant.

10. Portable Pens. Portable pens, barns, or stalls are not allowed at WestWorld, except as may be provided by WestWorld.

11. Smoking. Smoking is not permitted in WestWorld indoor arenas, buildings, and barn areas or any other area where signs prohibiting smoking are posted.

12. RV Spaces: The owner must sign a Liability Release and Waiver Agreement stating that WestWorld is in no way responsible for the care, custody, or control of their vehicle or their actions while at WestWorld. Event attendees and RV guests using RV spaces allocated to the event shall register with the event producer and not with WestWorld and shall sign Liability Release and Waiver Agreements. (This sentence does not apply to our Show, as we have no RV spaces allocated to our event. The Liability Release will be signed when you check in at the RV Office.) All RV units must be equipped with holding tanks for gray water and black water.

13. Pets: All pets must be kept on a leash at all times and held by a person unless the pet is confined inside a permitted pen, stall, or RV. All pet feces must be picked up and properly disposed of by the person responsible for the pet. Any pet in a barn area must be on a leash or secured in a stall.
